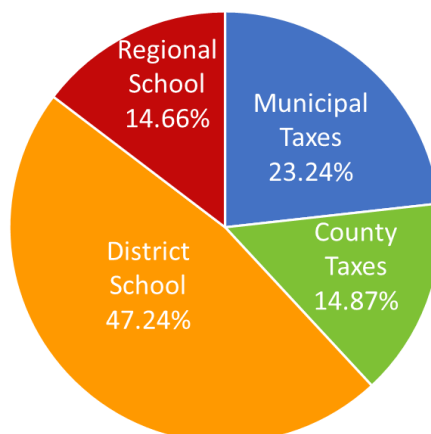

Remember thunderstorms can occur any time of year in New Jersey. However, severe thunderstorms generally occur during the warmer months of March through October. A typical thunderstorm is 15 miles in diameter and lasts an average of 30 minutes - far smaller than a hurricane or a winter storm. Despite their small size, however, ALL thunderstorms are dangerous. Every thunderstorm produces lightning. Prepare yourself and your family by creating an Emergency Supply Kit. Make sure your phone is charged. Check for hazards in the yard. Know the warning signs. Stay Informed using: TV , radio and phone apps.

### Recycling Schedule: Sept - Dec 2021

Brush and Leaf pickup will continue through November. All items must be placed curbside by 7 AM. We will make one trip through town. CURBSIDE PICKUP ONLY! Brush must be cut in lengths of no longer than 5 ft. Leaves must be placed in biodegradable bags.

The following items will **NOT** be picked up:

- Plastic bags. They are not biodegradable!
- Bags that are too heavy.
- Bags containing metal wire, plastic, rocks or concrete.
- Brush over 5 ft. in length.

If we do not pick up your leaves and brush a notice will be left explaining why.

If you cut down trees or have them taken down we will not be able to pick them up - this is a brush service only.
