1. Verizon Lease Proposal Update

Attorney Clemack informed the Council that he spoke to a representative of TK Designs on behalf of the Verizon Lease proposal; needing information regarding the poles, the bid and specs. Attorney Clemack is requesting an on- site meeting with them and Borough officials to point out necessary information and he has heard nothing back to date.

ENGINEERING

1. Well No. 2 Bid Results-November 13, 2014 Bid date

Mayor Marino gave the bid results for the emergency backup generator for well #2, stating that High Point Electric, Inc. was the low bidder at \$87,690.00. He also said that John Ruschke has recommended the company. The money will come out of the water / sewer improvement fund and is less that what the project was expected to cost.

Motion by Councilman Garrett, seconded by Councilman Barr to approve and accept the bid from High Point Electric, Inc. at \$87,690.00 for the emergency backup generator for well #2.

DISCUSSION

Councilman Law asked if there was any paperwork for back-up as this bid is almost 20% lower than the other two bids.

Motion by Councilman Law, seconded by Councilman Garrett to open the discussion to Water Superintendent Gerald Kastner. All in favor.

Mr. Kastner stated that he noticed the difference also between the bids but High Point is a competitive

bidder and he is confident of their work and very reputable.

2. Water Superintendent Contract

Mayor Marino discussed with Mr. Kastner the yearly contracts that he and Mr. Schneider have with BPW, stating that since the contracts are presented at the BPW meeting in January, they are not included with the salary increases for Borough employees, and this causes a bit of confusion. Mr. Kastner stated that his is a base pay, split into different departments, with only the water subject to the raise, but the sewer portion of the pay has been frozen for ten years, along with Mr. Schneider's contract for sewer assistant. He knows Mr. Schneider is a bit disappointed with it and Mr. Schneider feels that he should have that raise also.

Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Law to close to Mr. Kastner. All in favor.

MAYOR'S AGENDA

1. League of Municipalities

Mayor Marino attended the League but was only there for one day. He stated there was a great deal of talk regarding the fact that municipalities were still not receiving any relief money from superstorm Sandy. He also said he was busy working on Council appointments for January.

Mayor Marino relayed that he met Senator Littell years ago and the senator was a man of action, asking him what he could do for him. Mayor Marino replied that he needed \$100,000.00 for an ambulance as we had just lost a grant for roads and also a seat on the SCMUA board, and our Police Dept. building had mold in it. He said that two weeks later, we had received \$100,000.00 for an ambulance and a building. Senator Littell was truly a man of word and action.

The November 2014 monthly report for the Police Department showed 591 calls of service, including 7 arrests, 12 motor vehicle accidents, and 112 motor vehicle summonses issued (ETickets – 97, hard copies –

15).

Director Yahm stated that ETickets are being used and also hard copies when technology is not working properly. The new computer for the car is in and will be up and running soon. The officers just got a stolen car off the roads so they are hitting the streets.

Councilman Burd stated that the school received a Clean Energy contract, and after all is said and done with the installations of items, they will be saving approximately \$20,000.00. He also informed the Council that two teachers, Ms. Barbara Green and Ms. Kim Ivanov, will be retiring at the end of the year.

Councilman Law announced that the tree lighting will take place at 6:30 PM on December 5th; Breakfast

with Santa will be held on December 13^{th} from 9 AM - 11 AM at the Firehouse; the Fire Dept. Santa Run on December 20^{th} ; and the Holiday Decorating Contest will take place from December 17^{th} - 24^{th} . He also recognized Chris Fitzpatrick for all the clinics that he holds at the Hamburg School and the tremendous amount of work that goes into organizing and putting them on.

Councilman Law and Borough Clerk Doreen Schott filled out the Liaison section of the Open Space Report for the year and will be working with Mr. Schneider in the next few days to complete the report and then submit it for the grant

Councilman Garrett discussed the memo from the BPW regarding an ordinance change referencing the service fee once the water / sewer bill is due for disconnection. As it stands now, a resident is charged \$50.00 for disconnection; the BPW would like to change that to \$100.00 after the first quarter offense. Should the bill remain outstanding after a second quarter, a \$200.00 service fee would be imposed. There would be a \$200.00 max on the fee. Mayor Marino also stated that it was a waste of time for personnel to go out and begin to turn off the water, only to have the resident run out and try to pay them. Most of the residents are repeat offenders that are able to pay but chose not to pay. Councilmembers have no objection. Attorney Clemack will prepare the wording and an ordinance change for January.

COUNCILMAN SENA

1. FINANCE / TAX DEPARTMENT

Employee Raises

Salary

Councilman Sena discussed the 2015 salary raises for the employees, stating that previously the Council has used the Road Dept. contracts and Police percentages as guidelines. Road Dept. no longer has a contract. Motion by Councilman Sena, seconded by Councilman Law to give the Borough employees a 3% raise. Councilman Law asked if this would be within the cap for the new year, if we did have a cap and Mayor Marino said it would be a "gray area", due to the interest arbitration in the Police Dept. but for the time being, there is no legislation, so the 3% is fine.

Council discussed this to include Water Superintendent Gerald Kastner and Road Dept. Foreman Mike Schneider contacts with BPW. Councilman Krasnomowitz asked why this would affect their contract. Mayor Marino answered that they usually bring their contracts in to BPW in January so they are not part of the negotiations. He stressed that this does not mean that every year they will receive the raise but that since they have not had one in ten years, that perhaps this was the year to do so.
