Per Ordinance 70-12 Regulation of dogs. Section B. "No person owning, keeping or harboring any dog shall suffer or permit it to be upon the public or private streets or in any public place of the Borough of Hamburg unless such dog is accompanied by a person over the age of 12 years and is securely confined and controlled by an adequate leash not more than six feet long."

During the summer months the Road Department will be picking up grass clippings **only on Mondays and Fridays**. Please have the bags curbside by 7 A.M. We will only make one trip through town each day. Bags placed curbside after the truck

has passed will remain until the next pickup date. Remember: only properly bagged grass and leaves will be picked up. No rocks, dirt, dog waste or household garbage should be placed in the bags. If bags are too heavy or ripped open, they will not be picked up. Please do not put bags in the gutter of the roadway; if it rains they break open, grass gets into the storm drains and plugs up the lines.

We also ask that all homeowners please refrain from blowing cut grass into public streets. It's important to keep the storm drains clear of debris, especially cut grass which can cause serious clogs. Exciting News! 2019- 2020 brings several new programs to our school thanks to grant funding and Thor Labs. Robotics will be available to all students, PK-8 grade. Interested students in Grades 3-4 may participate in Lego League Jr. and grades 5-8 will compete in the First Lego League which challenges them to think like scientists and engineers. Students build, test, and program robots to solve missions.

Students and staff will also learn about hydroponic farming in our new hydroponic lab. All students will participate in the growing and harvesting of crops which will be served in our cafeteria, as well as learning about the history, data collection, impact of temperature, insects, and nutrients.
