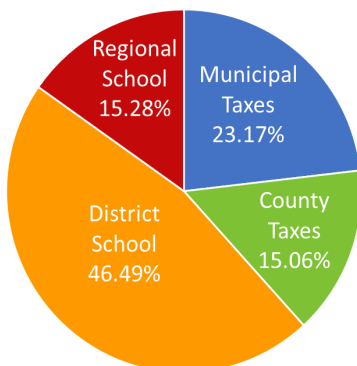

Washing trash containers with hot water and chlorine bleach or ammonia at least once a week to eliminate odors and putting out garbage on collection day, not the night before helps discourage the bears. Brush and Leaf pickup will continue through November. All items must be placed curbside by 7 AM. We will make one trip through town. **CURBSIDE PICKUP ONLY!** Brush must be cut in lengths of no longer than 5 ft. Leaves must be placed in biodegradable bags.

The following items will **NOT** be picked up:

- Plastic bags. They are not biodegradable!
- Bags that are too heavy.
- Bags containing metal wire, plastic, rocks or concrete.
- Brush over 5 ft. in length.

If we do not pick up your leaves and brush a notice will be left explaining why.

If you cut down trees or have them taken down we will not be able to pick them up - this is a brush service only.

Biodegradable bags are available at the Borough Hall M-F from 8 AM - 3 PM. 10 bag limit per Hamburg Resident. Please honor the limit so we will have enough for everyone. Thank you.

**Be Ready for Hurricane Season!**

New Jersey's tropical storm activity is typically between August and late October. To stay informed - Use credible websites to get information about natural hazards and emergency preparedness.

The NJOEM works closely with the National Weather Service and the National Hurricane Center regarding storm predictions and forecasts, check out their websites.

Connect with your local information sources. Be sure you have a phone charger to keep your phone charged if the power goes out. The National Weather Service can now send free weather warnings directly to your mobile phone if a hazard is imminent in New Jersey. Check with your carrier to see if your mobile phone is enabled to receive these messages.
