

**HAMBURG BOARD OF HEALTH
MEETING MINUTES**

MEETING DATE July 12, 2011

CALL TO ORDER In accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act, with regard to notices, the regularly scheduled meeting of the Hamburg Borough Board of Health was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion by board member Adams, second by Kays to approve the minutes of February 4, 2011. All members present in favor.

SANITATION REPORT

1. Inspections were performed at the beach and pools. The pool at the Fairways at Wallkill received a pre operational and a follow up inspection will take place in one month,
2. All food establishments in town are up to date with their food licensing for the year 2011 and the county is approximately half way through the food inspections.
3. Complaint regarding solid waste at 16A and 16B Oak Street. Upon inspection it was found that both homes have been vacated and the solid waste was left at both residences. Both homes were rentals and owned by the same owner. I contacted the Zoning Officer who along with the Sussex County Board of Health will be sending out notices of violations.
4. 35 Vernon Avenue – Solid waste complaint – Received a complaint regarding an outdoor garage full of garbage. Upon inspection it was found that the garage was full to the door with garbage. Owner stated that he had no curbside pick up and has been storing the garbage in the garage since the winter. It was later learned that this has occurred at this residence in the past. Owner was notified that a Notice of Violation was going to be issued. Later inspection showed that the garbage had indeed been cleaned up.
5. Cravin Thai – Inspector advises that they were inspected and received a pre – operational and he will do a follow up. They are open for business.
6. 12 Prospect Avenue – Dog bite incident – animal was quarantined and released. Board members discuss the recent rabies incidents as reported in Wantage. Inspector advises that there were several areas where there appear to be a cluster

of animals and with the recent attaches some were found to be carrying the virus. Inoculations on those persons affected have started. He will keep the board informed of this and any other similar incidents. Board members question what the procedure is if there is a dog bite incident. Inspector advises that the person bitten if they seek medical treatment the doctor, ER attendant or if notified the police would report it and then the animal would be quarantined. If it is not reported or treatment sought then the person would have to report it themselves for the animal control officer to act.
