ENGINEERING: Given by Mayor Marino

Mayor Marino informed the Council that he met with the DOT in Mt. Arlington with Mr. Ruschke and Councilman Garrett to discuss the Rt. 23 Water Main work around the culvert. The architectural drawing and plan were submitted and the plan was just approved so the work will start tomorrow on the culvert with the road work starting by the end of the week.

As far as the paving of the road, Mayor Marino said that \$30-40,000.00 does not need to be spent if the State will be paving the road next year, so he will be contacting Debbie Hirt from the State to find out the status of that.

The Well #3 project will be starting next week, taking 8 weeks to fabricate and 3-6 days to put it together.

MAYOR'S AGENDA:

PRESENTATION:

Senior Citizen of the Year Award

2013 Senior Citizen Award – Mrs. Linda Adams

Mayor Marino presented a 2013 Senior Citizen Award to Mrs. Linda Adams for her years of dedication and service to the town, for all that she has brought to the town and for serving on all the boards.

2013 NJDOT Municipal Aid Grant - Grant denied

Mayor Marino stated that the Borough received notice that the application for the 2013 NJDOT Municipal Aid Grant was denied.

Vacancies Board of Health

Mayor Marino also stated that there are vacancies in the Board of Health due to resignations as addressed under Board of Health.

Resignation JoAnn McNulty - Recreation

Mayor Marino stated that JoAnn McNulty verbally relayed to him that she will no longer be able to serve on the Recreation Commission as she has not attended in over 6 months.

Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilwoman Oehler to accept the verbal resignation of JoAnn McNulty due to personal reasons and to declare a vacancy on the Recreation Commission. All in favor.

Letters regarding Gingerbread Castle Road

Mayor Marino said he was upset about not being notified in advance of Hardyston re-surfacing Wheatsworth Road, stopping at Gingerbread Castle Road as he would have liked to have the company continue on to finish up to Rt. 23. He also mentioned that King Cole Road needs to be resurfaced also.

John Kraft - Bonds

Mayor Marino spoke to Mr. Kraft about the bonds and the Borough being tax exempt or having low interest bonds. Now the State is trying to cap out at 28% total overall. Attorney Clemack will write a resolution after Mr. Kraft visits to explain the whole situation.

Mayor Marino also thanked all that attended for the Memorial Day Services.

COMMITTEE REPORT

COUNCILMAN SENA

1. FINANCE / TAX DEPARTMENT

The Tax Collector's Report for April 2013 showed \$630,278.28 being collected.

2. ROAD DEPARTMENT

Ouotes for Storage Structure for equipment at Pavilion.

Motion by Councilman Sena, seconded by Councilwoman Oehler to open to Mike Schneider. All in favor. Councilman Sena was not able to meet with Mr. Schneider to discuss the storage structure. Mr. Schneider did have the schematics of the unit he wanted to purchase, but Councilmembers were confused by them. Mr. Schneider stated that it is placed on blocks, of which he already has 20 and needs 20-30 more. The company will put an extension on the door at no cost to us.

Since there are other questions that are unable to be answered, Mr. Schneider will contact the company for clarification and this item will be tabled until next month.

Motion by Councilman Krasnomowitz, seconded by Councilwoman Oehler to close to Mike Schneider. All in favor.

Surplus Vehicle bid - Discussion

The Borough has a 1998 GMC dump truck that is no longer needed and Council discuss putting it on the US Gov. Bid, who would get 5 ½ %. Council sets the price and after discussion, set the bid at \$3000.00 minimum bid with the plow included.

Motion by Councilman Krasnomowitz, seconded by Councilwoman Oehler to place the 1998 GMC dump truck on the government auction, with a \$3000.00 minimum bid, the plow included, and the mayor and municipal clerk are authorized to sign any necessary paperwork. All in favor.

Street Sweeping Inter local Agreement – Hardyston Township

Council is in receipt of the 2013 Sweet Sweeping agreement with Hardyston Township at a cost of \$114.00 per hour and as per contract agreements.

Motion by Councilman Sena, seconded by Councilman Law to approve said Inter-local agreement with Hardyston Township. All in favor.

3. BOARD OF HEALTH

Council is in receipt of a resignation letter from Peter Karas due to personal reasons.

Motion by Councilman Sena, seconded by Councilman Garrett to accept the resignation with regrets. All in favor.

Council is in receipt of a resignation letter from Dot Kays due to personal reasons.

Motion by Councilman Sena, seconded by Councilman Garrett to accept the resignation with regrets. All in favor.

Playground

Councilman Sena will be meeting with John Ruschke at 9 AM at the rec fields on Tuesday, June4th to discuss where the playground should be located. Mayor Marino asked about how the soccer is going, but Councilman Sena was not sure. He did notice that there was parking on the grass and dogs were there. A "one way sign" was supposed to have been place at the appropriate place but was not there. Councilman Barr said that it did need to be striped for "One Way" and he would talk to Mr. Ruschke about it. Council discusses parking in the lower field as there is not sufficient parking as is. More discussion will take place and will refer to Mr. Ruschke for advice also.

COUNCILMAN GARRETT

1. BOARD OF EDUCATION

Councilman Garrett stated the Board of Ed has their Conference on October 22-24. The school's IT project is going well. Two sets of concrete steps are being repaired.

2. WATER QUALITY

Councilman Garrett did not attend the meeting due to a conflict.

3. BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS

As Mayor Marino stated, he, Councilman Garrett and Mr. Ruschke met with the DOT about the Rt. 23 Water main project. The pipe was on the outside of the bridge and would have taken months to get DEP approval to change. So Mr. Ruschke redesigned the pipe to go over the culvert and then be encased in concrete to protect it. The project was held up only about one month.

The Inter-local with Hardyston with the water connection tower will have connection boxes, will be a benefit to us also, and Hardyston will be responsible for all costs.

COUNCILWOMAN OEHLER:

Ambulance Update

Councilwoman Oehler stated that a center console was decided upon- it was an additional \$400.00, and will come out of the EMS budget as per Jennifer Brennan, but now the wires will be covered, and it will also hold radios, clipboards, etc. The vehicle should be finished between June 15th - 20th. The vehicle is covered on our insurance when it arrives here. Councilman Sena asked if we were trading it in, auctioning it off, or selling it. At the moment, it was a wait and see approach to the auction and how that goes.

1. NEWSLETTER COMMITTEE

Information was in and the newsletter will be going out with the water / sewer bill the second week of June.

2. RECREATION

The Miss Hamburg Contests will be held Saturday, June 15th at 2 PM at the school. Councilwoman Oehler extended an invitation to all.

Summer Rec will be held July 15th – 26th. Registration is going on now.

Hamburg Day is August 25th. Vendor applications are starting to come in.

Councilwoman Oehler also asked what Rec's involvement in the playground will be and was answered that suggestions were welcomed but it would be a Council decision.

COUNCILMAN LAW:

1. BUILDING AND GROUNDS

Councilman Law discussed the old recreation building on Wallkill Ave, stating that it is a cement building. Since it does not have any historic designation, Mike Schneider will take apart sections and work with what is there.

The bottom of the garage door at the DPW building is rotting away as there is no vapor barrier, as are the supports (rotting away). This will need to be taken care of soon.

2. COURT

Matron Position at court.

The current matron at the court house is taking a long leave of absence, so another will be needed, and that person will need to be trained and certified.

Motion by Councilman Law, seconded by Councilman Barr to advertise for a matron for the court, including

training and certification. All in favor.

Gramco Business Communications - Quote for Digital Recording System

Councilman Law informed the Council that an upgrade of the recording system in the court is needed. JoAnn Coan and Councilman Law have been working with Finance for the past 3 years to budget for this expense. The quote from Gramco Business Communications for the Digital Recording System is for \$4895.00. Motion by Councilman Law, seconded by Councilman Garrett to approve the proposal for the Digital Recording System from Gramco Business Communications in the amount of \$4895.00. Councilman Sena asked how money could be held back for the past 3 years. Councilman Law said that it remains there —it doesn't go back to the fund balance.

3. RECYCLING AND SANITATION

Councilman Law stated that according to correspondence received from Reenee Casapulla regarding the recycling funding from the State, the money would be going back into the general fund, so it is up in the air as to what towns will be receiving, if anything. A table will be set up at Hamburg Day with recycling materials on it.

COUNCILMAN KRASNOMOWITZ:

1. OFFICE ADMINISTRATION

Council is in receipt of a letter of resignation from Melissa Morales due to her accepting a position elsewhere. Motion by Councilman Krasnomowitz, seconded by Councilman Law to accept the resignation with regrets. All in favor.

Council discussed the open position left by Melissa Morales, with Councilman Krasnomowitz stating that Marguerite Nemeth willing to work the 30 hours but cannot sign off on no benefits or she will be terminated from her husband's benefits also. Discussion continues to include all part time personnel and the amount of hours they work. Amount of hours will be looked into before the 30 hours are given. Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Krasnomowitz to hire Marguerite Nemeth at 29 hours per week subject to a review of insurance benefits. All in favor.

Overview of telephone system proposed by Princeton Hosted Solutions from Jeff Stabile.

Councilman Krasnomowitz stated that this would be a good asset to the Borough. They will come to the next Council meeting to give a presentation.

2. CONSTRUCTION DEPARTMENT

Construction Report 4/1/2013 – 4/30/2013

Councilmember Krasnomowitz advised that there were 12 permits issued, 2 certificates of occupancy, and 5 certificates of approvals with a total of \$2741.00 collected in fees for the month of April.

3. LAND USE BOARD

No meeting is scheduled.

COUNCILMAN BARR.

Welcome Borough of Hamburg Signs

Councilman Barr stated the signs would cost approximately \$840.00 per sign, be reflexive, and lettered on both sides. Although he would like to see 7 installed, in order to keep costs down, Councilman Barr would like to see 4 signs - at the Rt. 23 and Rt. 94 entrances into town. The Road Dept. will also install them to keep the costs down.

Councilman Krasnomowitz said that he did a great job and for years has tried to get signs. He would like to see the four signs installed. Councilman Sena asked where they would go and is there enough of the right of way

to place them there. Councilman Barr did not see a problem. Councilman Garrett asked how long it would take to get this done and installed and was answered by the fall.

Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Garrett to approve having 4 signs made by John Geddes at a cost of \$840.00 per sign for Welcome to the Borough of Hamburg. All in favor.

Councilman Barr also relayed that John Geddes would help the Road Dept. with the signs.

1. FIRE COMMISSIONER / OEM

Firemen's Membership Application – Eric Bellanca

Council is in receipt of an application for the Fire Dept. for Eric Bellanca. As per Director Yahm, the background check was favorable.

Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Garrett to accept the application for membership for Eric Bellanca in the Fire Dept. All in favor.

2. POLICE COMMISSIONER

Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Garrett to open the meeting to Director Yahm. All in favor.

Director Yahm stated that he will have the report next month. The computer issues have been resolved, along with the interferences at the towers. Advertising for another police officer has been posted. Motion by Councilman Barr, seconded by Councilman Krasnomowitz to close to Director Yahm.

Rob Owens – 23 Lime Kiln Road – discussed with the Council a summons he received about unregistered car, stating that he believed a warning would have been more appropriate as if it deals with the ordinances, how is anyone supposed to know what all the ordinances say until after the incident. Director Yahm said he would meet with him to discuss the situation. Mr. Owens, once he reviewed the ordinances, feels the ticket was given in error. Councilman Barr stated that it was at the discretion of the police, zoning, etc. to enforce. Mayor Marino was sympathetic to the situation, stating also that it was a pending case. When asked to get a copy of the court records, Mr. Owens was directed to see the court administrator, whom he already had, adding that he would have to spend approximately \$300.00 for a recording of the proceedings. Mr. Owens may research this further.

Sheila Frayko – Board of Education Liaison – stated that Hamburg School graduation was June 19th at 7:30 PM. When Ms. Frayko inquired about the status of the DARE program, Director Yahm said that by the end of summer it should be ready to go.
